

## **Analysis: Educational Outcomes**


KASB talks about graduation rates and college attendance data in their training materials, but they say nothing about state assessment results, ACT scores, and the National Assessment of Educational

Progress (NAEP). State assessment results are only valid back to 2015, when the current assessment was implemented (each new version has different standards that invalidate comparisons according to KSDE).



Since 2015, the share of students below grade level has been rising and proficiency levels have declined.

More historical information is available on ACT and NAEP and in both cases, results have declined even though spending has far outpaced inflation.
