What is JAG-K?

- Independent 501(c)3 organization
- One of 38 State Affiliates of Jobs for America's Graduates.
- Brought to Kansas in 2013
- In-school, elective class for credit
- Programming for System-Involved Youth
- Braided funding model with local, state, federal and private sources





Evidence Based Model

- ★ Competency Based Curriculum
- ★ Project Based Learning
- 🖈 Employer Engagement
- ★ Work-Based Learning
- Individual Development Plans
- Career Exploration and Skills Development
- ★ Career Association
- ★ Mandatory Community Service
- ★ 12-Month Engagement and 12-Month Follow-up
- ★ Small Class Sizes and maximum cohort of 60 students
- ★ Competition





Core Competencies

All students must master 37 core competencies to successfully complete the JAG program. The core competencies were developed following research that included employers' views on desired worker traits. The 37 core competencies are grouped into six clusters:

Career Development
Job Attainment
Job Survival
Basic Competencies
Leadership and Self-Development
Personal Skills



Who are JAG-K Students?



- 67% are eligible for free and reduced lunch
- 54% are students of color
- 49% are in the bottom 25% of academic class rank
- 50% live in single-parent homes or are separated from their parent(s)

Student Eligibility Criteria

Academic

- Low performance
- Basic skills deficiency
- Truancy/absences
- Suspended, expelled

Environmental

- Parent(s) not a HS graduate
- Parent(s) not working
- Is a parent
- Convicted of criminal offense/involved with justice system
- Homeless
- Runaway
- Needs Transportation
- Foster care

- Income and Work Related
 - Economically disadvantaged/poverty
 - Has inadequate or no work experience
 - Lacks marketable occupational skills

Personal

- Has a disability
- Special Education
- Emotional Disorder
- Health Problems that impair education or career goals
- Social
 - Experienced bullying/harassment
 - Contemplated or attempted suicide

By the Numbers

114 Programs in 48 school districts in 39 Kansas counties in 2024-25 (9 for system-involved youth)

★ Serving approximately 6200 students in FY 2025

★ 96% Graduation Rate

★ 84% Full-time Positive Outcomes (Post-Secondary Education, Military Service, Workforce)

★ 64% Further Education Rate



JAG-K as Prevention and Intervention Programming

+ Prevention


- Address risk factors of teen pregnancy, poverty and juvenile system involvement
- Connection with a caring and supportive adult/mentor

+ Intervention

- Students in foster care have a significantly higher graduation rate if they are in JAG-K
- Most justice-involved youth are served in their communities, and JAG-K offers an evidence-based program with consistent objectives and outcomes that have proven Outcomes to help students get on a successful path

 158 Programs in at least 53 counties by the start of the 2026-27 School Year.

★ Serving more than 9,000 students in FY 2027

★ Requires an increase of approximately \$4 million

★ School Districts pay approximately 15% of the cost

Mix of Urban and Rural Districts


