CAN is a **nonprofit organization founded in 2019** focused on creating educational opportunities for rural middle school students to support their journey toward secondary and post-secondary success. It is a **free program for eligible students**.

CAN also awards **educational grants in the amount of \$5,000** to eligible school district partners.

Need for Summer Learning Opportunities

Summer Slide

Summer learning loss, also known as the "Summer Slide", describes the common experience of students losing some of what they learned the previous year because they are not academically engaged or challenged during the summer. Students from third to eighth grade typically lose 25-30% of the gains made in math during the previous school year, and 15-25% of the gains in reading during the summer.

Middle School Matters

Middle School is a critical time for students as they work toward developing their own identities, confront physical changes, and face new social pressures. During summer, this age group is particularly at risk as they are **old enough to be left alone but not old enough to consistently make good choices**. The choices that are made at this time can impact a student's trajectory in high school and beyond.

The level of academic achievement that students attain by eighth grade has a larger impact on their college and career readiness by the time they graduate from high school than anything that happens academically in high school.

Improving grades and attendance in the middle grades can have a large pay-off for high school success; even more so than improving test scores. Students who improve their attendance or grades from fifth through eighth grade have better on-track rates, higher grades, and higher test scores in high school than students who start out with the same achievement in fifth grade but do not improve during the middle grades. Modest improvements in attendance or grades from fifth through eighth grade are associated with substantial differences in high school outcomes.

Summer Learning Opportunities

- The largest barrier to summer program participation is cost and affordability.
- 38% of low-income students participated in summer programs compared to 67% of higher income peers.
- > 86% of rural parents want summer learning opportunities for their children.
- ▶ 2.9 million rural children would have enrolled in a summer program had one been available to them.
- Parents enroll their children in summer programs for enrichment, fitness, fun, and social interaction.






Compass Student Outcomes

- CAN measured the impact of the program in three main areas which speak to future professionalism and life success: **Academic Preparation**, **Civic Responsibility**, and **Entrepreneurialism**.
- Academically, students attending the CAN summer program gained in grade point average (GPA) from one year to the next. For students who reenrolled in the program, their GPA's had increased from an average 3.1 in their first year enrolled to a 3.4 this past enrollment period.
- In the Civic Responsibility construct, CAN students posted statistically significant gains in Self-Management, Self-Awareness, Social Awareness, and Personal Ethics.
- CAN students were more likely to demonstrate **Entrepreneurial** characteristics, which include acknowledgement of informal **leadership** and an **internal push for personal achievement**. Students posted statistically significant growth in **Decision-Making** and **Goals Setting**.
